Louisiana Operation Lifesaver is a nonprofit, public education program established to end collisions, deaths and injuries at highway-rail intersections and on railroad rights-of-way.

To meet its lifesaving goals, Louisiana Operation Lifesaver promotes public awareness of the highway-rail grade crossing environment and encourages compliance with the traffic laws relating to crossing signs and signals, as well as the private property laws related to rail trespassing.
